Don't let strangers into your home

When someone calls at your door

- Don't let unexpected and unknown visitors into your home.
- Call someone you trust for advice before you answer the door.

Don't log in, don't give out numbers

If you let strangers into your home

- Don't hand over your bank card or valuables.
- Don't log in using your bank security token or your BankID.
- Don't give out or enter numeric codes anywhere.
- Don't accept services that you didn't order yourself – and don't pay for them.
- If there are strangers in your home, watch them carefully.

Remember: Serious companies, authorities and organisations will never contact you and ask you to give out codes or to log in using your bank security token.

Protect your code

When leaving your home

- Don't bring more cash and more bank cards than you need.
- Don't keep the code in the same place as your card.
- Protect your code when you make a payment or withdraw cash.
- Keep your wallet in an inside pocket or keep an eye on your purse.

These measures may also prevent crime

- Keep your front door locked even when you are at home.
- Don't keep more money than you need on the bank account that is linked to your bank card.
- Don't keep a lot of cash at home.
